


NEW SEASON

The New Season

Our season runs from October to July, with games played in Shield Division according to the Fixture List below. It is your responsibility to make sure that all games are completed by 31st July 2024 and results reported to me. Results that are not notified may be scored as a loss to both players. Please let me know if you were playing White or Black when notifying results in case of a tie. If you cannot complete a game or agree a result then a game may be submitted for adjudication but there is a charge for this for us to have access to the EFCC adjudication panel.

Ties are decided initially by the Baumbach Tie Break, then the Sonneborn-Berger Tie Break in accordance with ICCF procedures. These have been explained before but if you are not clear what how they work then email the Secretary for enlightenment.

In Shield Division you must play your games on Scheming Mind, or at least by email. Other Divisions can use post, telephone, or fax as well. If you are playing on Scheming Mind then the time limit is 30 days plus 1 day per move made, and this is maintained by the web server along with holiday leave etc. and it doesn't allow any leeway so if you break the time limit you lose!


If you use the scoresheets then the time columns are: 'R' is the date that you *received* your opponent's move; 'S' is the date you *send* your reply; 'T' is the *total time* used to date. This way you and your opponent can immediately see where you stand in relation to the time limit.

Shield Division Fixture List 2024 / 2025

There are seven players in Shield Division this season which requires 7 rounds, though one player will have a bye in each round. We don't want to start a round later than March to ensure there is time to complete it before the season ends so the first two rounds will have to begin fairly close together. Not all rounds are due to begin on 1st of the month to avoid weekend starts and, in the case of January, the Christmas period. The dates given below are the latest that each round should start, but if both players agree there is no reason why you should not start games earlier.

In the fixture list the player to the left of the 'v' plays White in Game 1 and is responsible for starting the games. When reporting results please let me know whether you were white or black in case of tie breaks later on.

We must have played something in the region of 100 games by now, and although I haven't kept a score, Antony is undoubtedly the better player and has won more of our games than I have. I suggested we might each nominate one game that we had won and write some notes for the magazine.

[I prefer a Bishop to a Knight]

To be honest this was not a game I should have won, but I felt I did well to salvage what I believed to be a draw from a potentially losing position.


1.d4 d5 2.Nf3 Bg4 3.e3 e6 4.c4 Bb4+ 5.Nbd2 Nf6 6.a3 Bxd2+ 7.Bxd2 0-0 8.h3 Bxf3 9.Qxf3

[I have now exchanged both my Bishops for his Knights, which on the whole I prefer, as time and again I have found a Knight a powerful piece to have in an endgame, as we will again see here.]

9...Ne4 10.Bb4 Re8 11.Bd3 Nd6 12.cxd5 exd5 13.Qxd5 Nc6 14.Bxd6 Qxd6 15.Qxd6 cxd6

[This was probably necessary though it leaves me a pawn down and with an isolated d pawn.]

16.0-0 d5 17.b4 a6 18.Rac1 Rac8 19.Rc5 Ne7 20.Rfc1 g6



[If the Rooks are coming off, I would prefer him to initiate it.]

21.Rxc8 Rxc8 22.Rc5 f5 23.f4 h5 24.Kf2 Kf7

[And even this early both Kings begin to come out into play, which is going to be a fixture of the game later on.]


25.Kf3 Rxc5 26.dxc5 Ke6 27.g4 Nc6 28.gxf5+ gxf5

[Again I prefer he initiates the exchange as I have a line of pawns on the 5th rank, each two spaces apart and more or less impassable.]

29.Kg3 Kf6 30.Kh4 Kg6 31.Be2 d4 32.exd4 Nxd4 33.Bxh5+ Kh6

[I have now lost that impregnable row of pawns and have gone two down, but my King and the f pawn can still keep his King in place.]

34.Be8 Nc2 35.c6 bxc6 36.Bxc6 Nxa3 37.Bb7 Nc2 38.Bxa6 Nxb4



[So that's the Queen side cleared out (to my advantage I think), and I am back to only one pawn deficit, but neither of us has the material to give mate unless we can promote a pawn.]

39.Bc8 Kg6 40.Kg3 Nd5 41.Kf3 Ne7 42.Bd7 Kh5 43.Kg3 Kg6 44.Kh4 Nd5 [My remaining Knight is now showing its superiority as it threatens White's f pawn and his Bishop. White can't get his King forward, nor either pawn, so I am really quite confident that I have neutralised the game and secured a draw.]

45.Be8+ Kh6 46.Kg3 Nf6

[And after playing Nf6 I formally offer a draw. Antony immediately declines, clearly thinking he can still get a win, but then, possibly distracted by the offer, plays a disastrous move.]

47.h4 Nxe8

[White resigns and I snatch victory from the jaws of ... well, I still think a draw!]
